The Algonquins of Ontario in partnership with Harkness Laboratory of Fisheries Research are seeking to hire an individual to participate in fisheries research projects in Algonquin Provincial Park. The successful candidate will be hired by the Ministry of Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources and Forestry (NDMNRF) to participate as a crew member for several fisheries projects including acoustic telemetry work, netting surveys, and creel surveys. The successful candidate may be required to work some weekends and evenings during the contract.

What can I expect to do in this role?

You will:

- Participate in downloading acoustic telemetry data on Smoke Lake, Algonquin Provincial Park
- Assist in conducting a lake trout spawning survey on Lake Opeongo, Algonquin Provincial Park
- Assist in conducting the Lake Opeongo Access Creel survey
- Record field data and biologically sample fish
- Enter and verify fisheries data in digital databases
- Participate in additional activities related to fisheries surveys such as preparing age and growth materials and stable isotope samples for further analysis

How do I qualify?

Mandatory Requirement:

- A valid class "G" driver's license or equivalent as recognized by the Province of Ontario
- A valid Pleasure Craft Operators Card
