

Class Environmental Assessments for the Tewin Infrastructure and Transportation Plans

The 2022 Ottawa Official Plan introduces 445.35 hectares of land into the urban boundary to facilitate the creation of Tewin, a new, sustainable and complete community that will be comprehensively planned and developed. The community planning and design process for Tewin is proposed to be advanced through an integrated Environmental Assessment process (Approach #3), informed by a robust consultation process.

The proposed development will deliver a livable, mixed-use, and transit-supportive community and the required supporting infrastructure (roads, water, sanitary sewers and stormwater facilities). The Transportation and Infrastructure Plans will be undertaken in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process using Approach #3, Integration with the Planning Act.
