Kwey Algonquin Tribunal members,

Attached is the last will for Margaret Ann Cameron, wife of deceased Allan McDonell dated September 1879.

To date, no historical document was found to show a link between the mother Margaret Ann Cameron and her children. She was always identified as only a "native women". With this package of historical documents you can now make the connection between her and her son Angus Cameron McDonell. When he was baptized it only listed his mother as a "native women". From her will and Angus Cameron McDonell's marriages you can now see that the "native women" is in fact Margaret Ann Cameron. Also attached to this package is the passport application for Allan Gerald Lundy McDonell, son of Angus Cameron McDonell. Important thing with this historical document indicates that his father Angus Cameron McDonell was born at Fort Temiscaming. You can now infer that Sophie McDonell's (born abt 1811) mother that was listed as a "native women" on her baptismal is Margaret Ann Cameron as well. This would also apply to all the children of Allan McDonell & Margaret Ann Cameron.

.I've attached other documents for your reference as proof of the above.

This has been very hard on their families and would hope that this information will help with your deliberations. Let me know if you require any clarification.

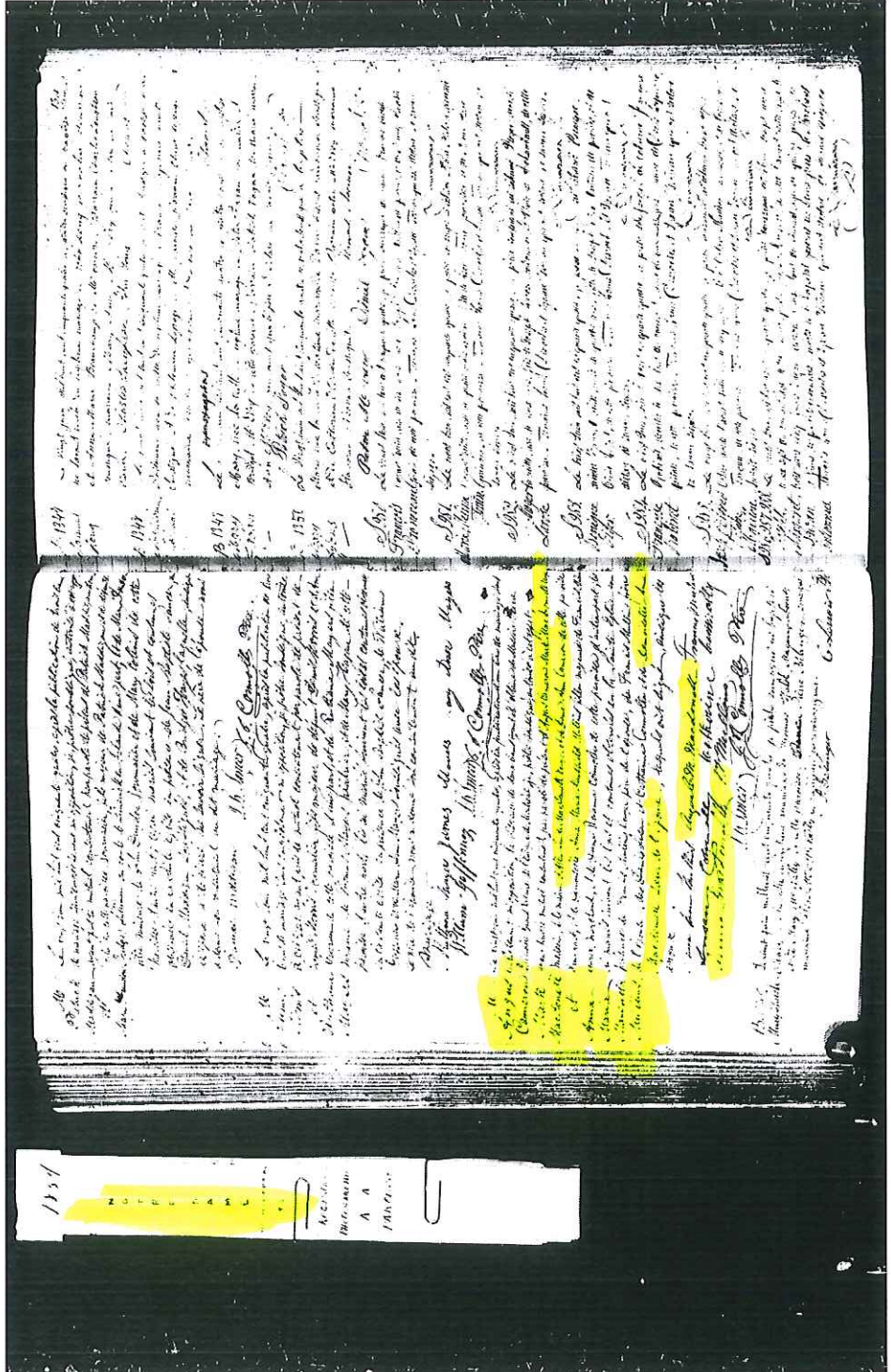

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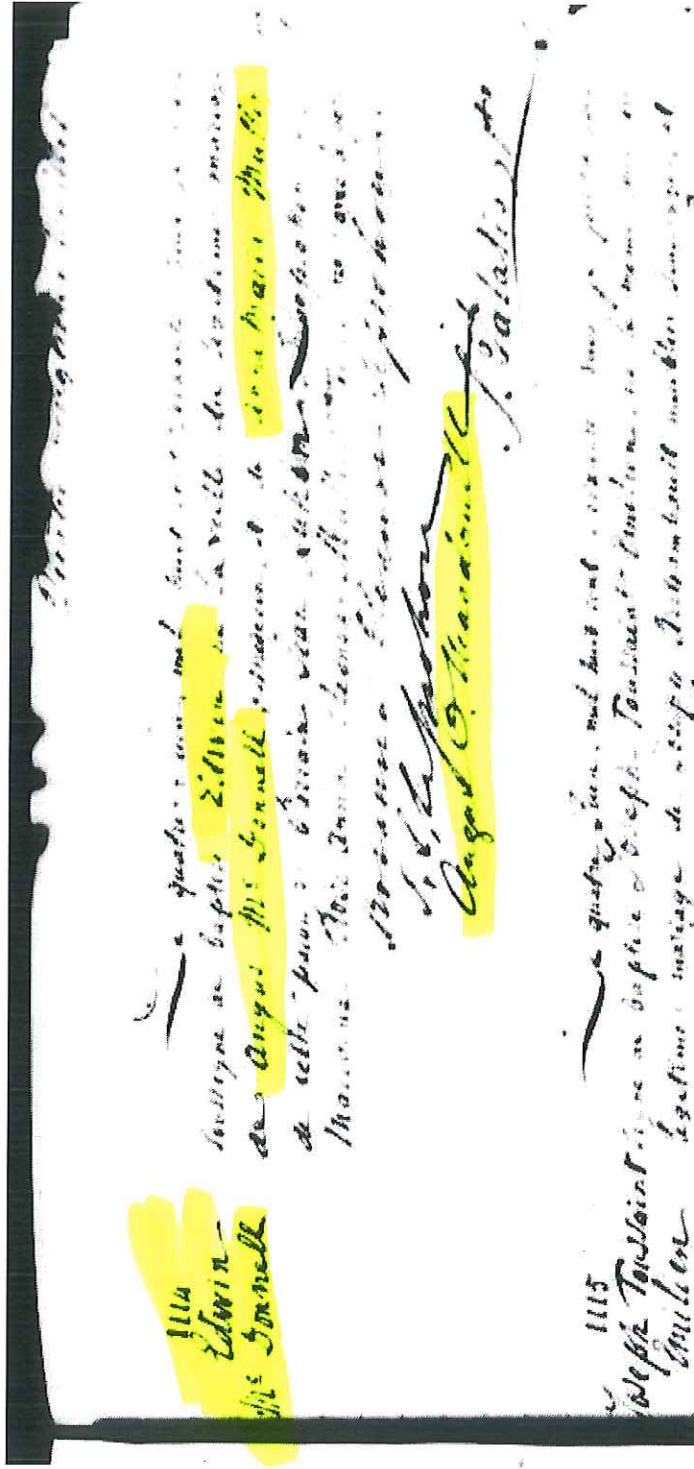

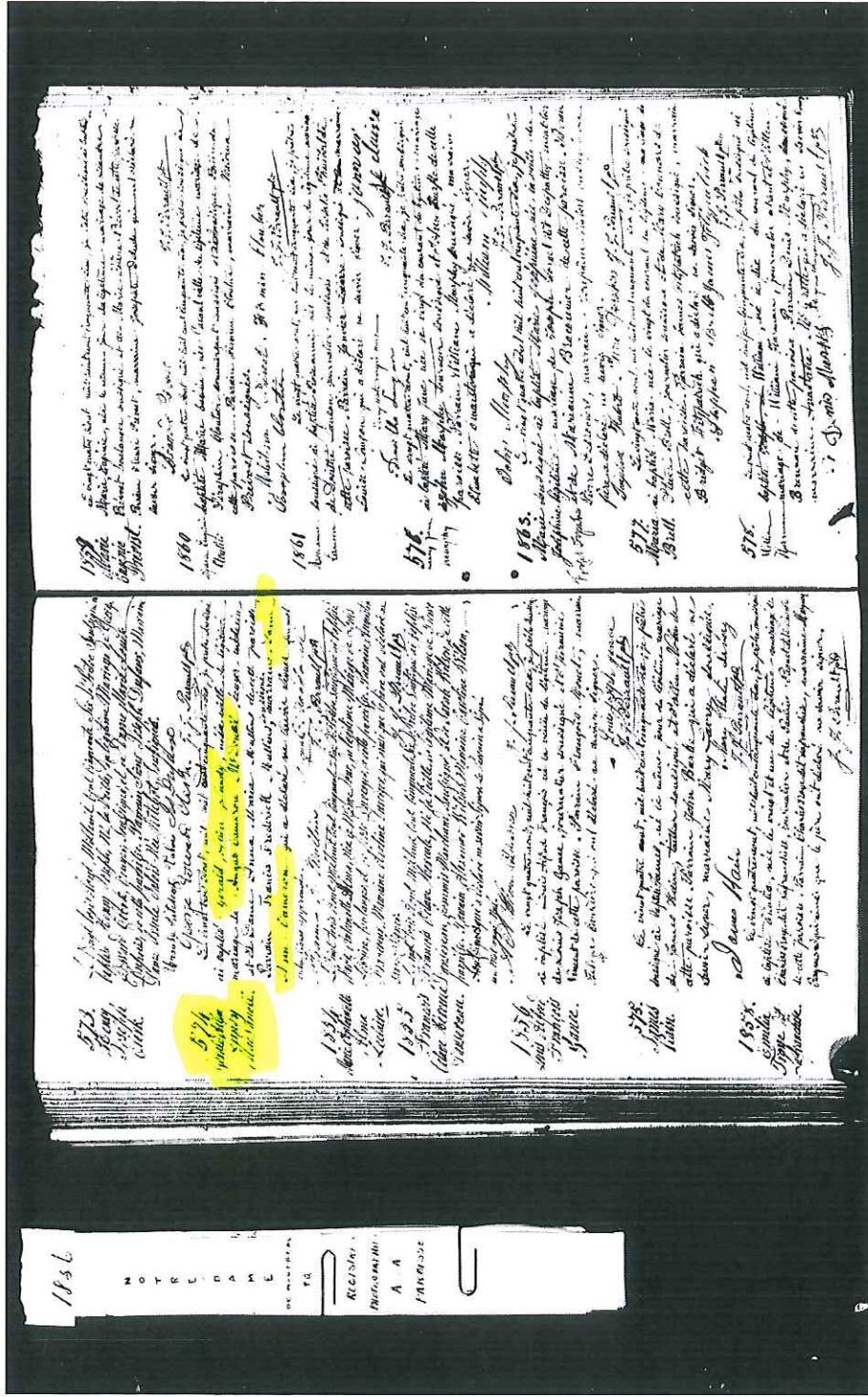

DR. ANGUS C. MACDONELL, WELL KNOWN PHYSICIAN, HAS PASSED AWAY.

The death is announced of Dr. Angus C. Macdonell, one of the oldest physicians in Montreal.

The event took place at the family residence, 778 Jagauchiere street, yesterday, as a result of pneumonia, contracted during the recent cold spell while the doctor was visiting a patient.

The deceased was the eldest son of the late Allan Lundy Macdonell, formerly of Inverness, Scotland, and latterly of this city, chief factor of the Hudson Bay Company, and governor at Fort Temiscamingue.

Dr. Macdonell, after studying at the high school in this city and the Upper Canada College, Toronto, entered McGill University, where he secured his degree of M. D. in 1852.

On his return from Europe in 1851, he married Miss Anna Mansfield Mullins, sister of the late poet and authoress, Mrs. Lepron. Mrs. Macdonell, died in 1876, and in 1880 he married Miss Marie L. Filia-trault, who survives him.

He leaves six children, of whom Mrs. E. L. de Bellefeuille and Miss Geraldine Macdonell are residents of this city.

The doctor was for more than twenty years on the consulting staff of the Hotel Dieu Hospital, and for many years attending physician on the Roman Catholic arch-bishops.

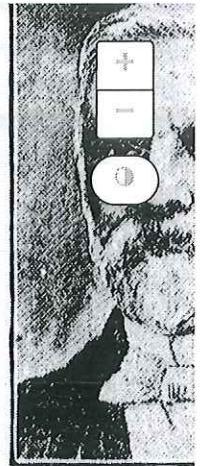
