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## **1. Introduction**

The Tribunal received submissions from two individuals in support of retaining the ancestor Cecile McDonnell dite Mawishk (aka Cecile McDonnell-Mawiskak, RIN #14687) on the Schedule of Algonquin Ancestors. The submissions are posted on the Tribunal's website at:

The submissions were filed in response to the Enrolment Officer's Report on Ancestor Cecile McDonnell-Mawiskak, dated November 2022, which is posted on the website as Document 1 – Enrolment Officer's Report Regarding Ancestor Cecile McDonnell-Mawiskak & Appendices.

This responding report addresses the content of the submissions that are relevant to the Tribunal's inquiry, which is to determine whether Cecile McDonnell dite Mawishk is identified in a historic record or document dated on or before December 31, 1921, in such a way that it would be reasonable to conclude she was considered to be an Algonquin or Nipissing, or a sibling of such a person. A "sibling of such a person" means a person with a common Algonquin parent.

The submissions refer to documents that are contained in the Enrolment Officer's Report, as well as new documents. As noted in the Enrolment Officer's Report, archival documents recording a family's life events have been assigned ALG document numbers; RIN numbers have been assigned to individuals discussed in the report to aid in identification. Both RIN numbers and ALG numbers will be referenced in this report for ease of discussion. New relevant historical documents submitted by the respondents and additional records retrieved by the Enrolment Office are assigned ALG numbers, listed in Appendix A and attached in Appendix B for ease of reference.

## **2. Document #2 – Initial Submission by J. Poirier**

The respondent J. Poirier submitted several archival documents, photographs, a biographical entry on Aeneas Cameron (1757-1822), and a family tree for Hector Green (1913 to 1930), which are discussed below.

### **2.1 Document ALG-07288**

This is the baptismal record from the church register at Maniwaki for Marianne Lorion (aka Dorion, RIN #13764). It shows that she was born on February 11, 1845 and baptized several months later on June 8, 1845 at Mattawan Post (aka Mattawa). Her parents are noted in the document as Narcisse Lorion and Cecile McDonell. This document is discussed on page 6 of the Enrolment Officer's Report. The godparents are listed as "Simon Nimasiba" and "Marie 8ackijikok8e," who have not been identified.

This document shows that the married couple Narcisse Lorion (aka Dorion, RIN #14686) and Cecil McDonell (RIN #14687) had a daughter named Marianne (aka Caroline Marianne RIN #13764) who was baptized at Mattawa in 1845. It does not provide any information on the ethnicity of the parties.

### **2.2 Aeneas Cameron**

The respondent supplied a biographical entry regarding Aeneas Cameron published by the Archives of Manitoba.

According to Aeneas Cameron's biographical sketch, Aeneas was born in Scotland in 1757. He immigrated to Montreal in 1788 where he worked with the North West Company (NWC), becoming a partner in 1798. He was in charge of the Temiscamingue District until 1804. He had at least one daughter, Margaret, with an unnamed Indigenous woman at Fort Temiscamingue.

Aeneas Cameron (RIN #55146) is referenced briefly in the Enrolment Officer's Report as the reputed father of Margaret Cameron (RIN #14101). Margaret Cameron was the spouse of Allan McDonell (RIN #57432). The Enrolment Officer's report provided information on documents related to documented children of Margaret Cameron and Allan McDonell at pages 13 to 14. Aeneas Cameron, his daughter Margaret, and her spouse and children are discussed further in response to another party's submission, see below under section 3.

### **2.3 Alexander McDonell**

The respondent supplied what appears to be a download regarding Alexander McDonell (aka Alexander McDonnell or McDonald, RIN #14097). The source of these pages is not provided but is most likely material posted by users on a genealogical website in 2016. The narrative claims that Alexander McDonell is the son of Allan McDonell (RIN #57432) and Margaret McDonell (aka Margaret Cameron, RIN #14101) and that the subject ancestor, Marie Cecile Mawiskak McDonell, is his sister. Alexander McDonell married Mary Ann McKay (RIN #14098). The narrative also supplies some information on Alexander McDonell's service with the Hudson's Bay Company (HBC) at Fort Temiskaming. The narrative appears to be drawn from work conducted by the Metis Nation of Ontario. The only primary document cited is the 1881 census listing a man named Alexander McDonell. The 1881 census provided in this document could not be enumerating Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097), as he died in 1853.<sup>1</sup>

No documentation was supplied by the respondent supporting the assumption that Cecile McDonell was the daughter of Allan McDonell and Margaret Cameron and the sister of Alexander McDonell.

Information regarding Alan McDonell (various spellings) and Margaret Cameron is provided in the Enrolment Officer's Report on pages 13-14. The information is supported by HBC biographical sheets published by the Archives of Manitoba and a study of Fort Temiskaming published by historian Elaine Mitchell. These sources support the contention that Allan McDonell had a country marriage with Margaret Cameron, the daughter of Aeneas Cameron and his unnamed Indigenous wife. However, none of the reputable secondary sources or primary sources available have shown a positive link between the subject ancestor Cecile McDonell and her purported parents Allan McDonell and Margaret Cameron. The sources do support Alexander McDonell as being the son of Allan McDonell and Margaret Cameron. In addition, the sources referenced in the Enrolment Officer's Report named Margaret and Allan's children as: Alexander, Angus, John, Allan, Ann, Sophie/Sophia, and Margaret.

This family is discussed further in response to another party's submission, see below under section 3.

#### ***2.4 Additional Families Referenced***

The respondent also references Marie Anne Pinesiwabanokwe (RIN #6782) who was married to Dominique Patwe (RIN #6781) and their son François (RIN #5263). The Enrolment Officer has no comment on these individuals as there is no known link to the ancestor under discussion.

The respondent also references William Hudson (RIN #58273) and Marie Okapeyadjiwanokwe (RIN #55766) and their daughter Marie Anne (RIN #24201). The Enrolment Officer has no comment on these individuals as there is no known link to the Ancestor under discussion.

#### ***2.5 Photograph***

The respondent supplied a family photograph. The Enrolment Officer has no comments on this photograph.

#### ***2.6 Family Tree***

The respondent supplied a partial family tree for Hector Green (1913 to 1930). The family tree shows a link between Marie Anne Caroline (RIN #13764) and her father, Pierre Narcisse Dorion (RIN #14686). The respondent also noted that many Algonquin families were of mixed Indigenous and non-Indigenous descent.

The Enrolment Officer has no comment on this family tree nor the fact of mixed heritage amongst Algonquins as these points do not pertain directly to the question of Cecile McDonell's Indigenous identity.

### **3. Documents #3, 4 & 5 – Initial Submission by C. Bastien Jr. on behalf of himself and his community**

C. Bastien Jr. forwarded an initial submission to the Tribunal in support of retaining ancestor Cecile McDonnell-Mawiskak on the Schedule of Ancestors. The submission was forwarded in three parts and pertained to ancestors Anna McDonald (RIN #2197) and ancestor Cecile McDonell dit Mawishk (RIN #14687). In this responding report, the Enrolment Officer focuses on the elements of the submission that are relevant to the parentage and identity of ancestor Cecile McDonell dit Mawishk (RIN #14687). The elements that are relevant to ancestor Anna McDonald are discussed in a separate responding report.

The submission was forwarded in three parts. Part 1 included a two-page outline of his reasons and supporting historical documents. Part 2 included additional supporting documents. Part 3 included a memo on Margaret Cameron and supporting documents. The supporting documents in all three parts are baptismal records, census records, Hudson's Bay Company records, biographical sketches, and a will. The Enrolment Officer responds to the submission under four topic headings as organized by the respondent.

In summary, the respondent states that the historical records demonstrate that the ancestor Cecile McDonell (RIN #14687) was the child of Allan McDonell and Margaret Anne Cameron and also the sister of Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097).

The respondent also asserts that the historical records demonstrate that Anna McDonald (RIN #2197) was the daughter of Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097). On that basis, the respondents submits that Anna McDonald (RIN #2197) is therefore a niece of Cecile McDonell.

The McDonald and McDonell surnames appear with various spellings in the historical documentation; the variations are reflected in this report.

#### ***3.1 Age of Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097) and Cecile McDonell (RIN #14687)***

The respondent provided evidence regarding the probable years of birth of Alexander McDonell and Cecile McDonell. The purpose of this discussion was to demonstrate that the two were born in the same general time period, could have been siblings, and that Alexander McDonell was possibly older than Cecile McDonell.

The respondent concluded that **Alexander McDonell** (various spellings) was probably born between 1806 and 1809 based on records regarding his marriage in 1837 and his contract with the Hudson's Bay Company (HBC). Records regarding Alexander McDonell's age are as follows:

- Alexander McDonell entered a contract for employment with the HBC on July 14, 1826.<sup>2</sup> His father Alan McDonnell (RIN #57432) signed for him which suggests that Alexander was under age (i.e., less than 21 years old) when the contract was made. Alexander's date of entering service is verified on this HBC biography sheet as is the fact that his

father Allan McDonell signed for him. The contract specifies that Alexander is the son of Allan.<sup>3</sup> The fact that he was underage on July 14, 1826 places his date of birth after July 14, 1806. The respondent concludes that he was most likely between 17 and 20 years of age when he entered service, which would be consistent with HBC practices. These facts suggest a birth date no later than 1809.

- The guide entitled "Understanding the Index to HBC Servants' Contracts, 1776-1927" on the Archives of Manitoba website states that the approximate age of the employee who signed the contract appears at the top of the contract. In the case of Alexander McDonell, the age of 17 is given at the very top of the contract page. This would give Alexander the confirmed birth year of 1809.<sup>4</sup>
- Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097) married Mary Ann McKay (RIN #14098) at Temiskaming on July 31, 1837. Both the bride and groom were resident at the Hudson's Bay Company (HBC) post at Temiskaming/Temiscamigue at the time of their marriage. The record shows that he was "majeur," meaning that at the time of the marriage he had reached the age majority, which was 21 years of age. This record suggests that he was born prior to July 30, 1816. The record identifies him as "Metis," meaning of mixed Indigenous and non-Indigenous descent. Alexander's parents are not named on the document.<sup>5</sup> Alexander's father, Allan McDonell, was known to be born in Scotland;<sup>6</sup> consequently, Alexander's Indigenous heritage must have come from his mother.

The respondent based his conclusions about the probable year of birth and age of **Cecile** from records regarding her marriage on June 22, 1837, a death record of 1875, and census records from 1861 and 1871. The respondent concluded that Cecile was born between 1807 and 1816. The Enrolment Officer's Report suggests that she was born between 1807 and 1813. The facts regarding her age are as follows:

- Marie Cecile McDonell dite Mawishk (RIN #14687) married Narcis Laurion (aka Narcisse Pierre Dorion, RIN #14686) at Mattawa on June 22, 1837.<sup>7</sup> Both parties were of age suggesting Cecile was born prior to June 22, 1816.
- The 1861 census states that Cecile was 48 years old; therefore born prior to the spring of 1813.<sup>8</sup>
- The 1871 census, taken on April 13, states the Cecile was 64; suggesting she was born prior to April 13, 1807.<sup>9</sup>
- Cecile's burial record dated April 23, 1875 notes she was about 62,<sup>10</sup> suggesting she was born prior to April 23, 1813.

- Cecile's oldest daughter Marie Cecile was baptized at 14 months on February 7, 1835.<sup>11</sup> This record suggests that Cecile's oldest child was born around January 1834, perhaps as early as December 1833. Based on the suggested age range for Cecile's being between 1807 and 1816, this would have made her between 18 years old (if born in 1816) and 27 years old (if born in 1807) at the time of her oldest child's birth.
- Cecile had 19 known children born about two years apart from 1834 to 1857. Her youngest known child, Louisa Dorion (RIN #57492,) was born circa 1857.<sup>12</sup> Depending on Cecile's year of birth she would have been between 41 (if born in 1816) and 50 (if born in 1807) years of age at the time of her youngest child's birth.

Evidence regarding the documented children of Margaret Cameron and Allan McDonell are discussed below.

### ***3.2 Age and Identity of Margaret Cameron and her children***

The respondent asserted that Margaret Ann Cameron (RIN #14101) was the wife of Allan McDonell and the mother of several children including the subject ancestor Cecile McDonell (RIN #14687).

The evidence regarding Margaret Anne Cameron, her spouse and their children is drawn from several sources including the HBC biographical sheet of her husband Allan McDonell,<sup>13</sup> the historical study of the fur trade at Fort Temiskaming by Elaine Mitchell,<sup>14</sup> her baptismal record,<sup>15</sup> and her burial record<sup>16</sup> which are cited in the Enrolment Officer's Report. Additional information is provided by the respondent in the form of Margaret Anne Cameron's last will and testament and several baptism and burial records. In addition, the genealogists for the Enrolment Office located and retrieved additional information about the family. The evidence of the children of Margaret Cameron and Allan McDonell is amalgamated and summarized below in subsection 3.2.a.

#### ***3.2.a Margaret Cameron and Allan McDonell's documented children***

A variety of historical sources identify at least seven children of Allan McDonell and his country wife Margaret Cameron (aka Anne Cameron McDonell). The known details are as follows:

- Two children died young at the Red River Settlement. One was **Margaret McDonell** (RIN #22695) 1825-1835; the other is not named.<sup>17</sup> A letter located in the Hudson's Bay Company records retrieved by the Enrolment Office explains the circumstances.<sup>18</sup> The letter, dated April 1836, states that part of Allan McDonell's family was boarded at the Red River Settlement for a total of two years, being: "the mother" (presumably

Margaret Cameron) for two years; one daughter for 1.5 years; and one daughter for 0.5 years. The family had been placed there by Governor Simpson of the HBC. Allan McDonell's HBC Biographical sheet notes that he resigned due to ill health in August 1833 when he had been in charge of the Temiscamingue District.<sup>19</sup> Margaret, the mother, was baptized at the Red River in December 1833, her daughter Sophie/Sophia was baptized and married there in December 1834, and her daughter Margaret died and was buried there in September 1835. Allan McDonell returned to duty as the chief factor in charge of the Lac La Pluie District sometime around June 1835. It is most likely that the Governor placed Allan's country wife and daughters in the Red River settlement during his absence. The timing would suggest the two daughters boarded at the Red River with their mother Margaret Cameron were Sophie McDonell (RIN #22698) and Margaret McDonell (RIN #22695).

- Allan McDonell's HBC biographical sheet provides **Sophia McDonell's** (aka Sophie McDonell, RIN #22698) year of birth as 1811.<sup>20</sup> Mitchell's study does not list Sophia. She may have been the other child who was referred to as dying young at the Red River but this is not clear.<sup>21</sup> She married John Livingston (RIN #22699) on December 18, 1834<sup>22</sup> having been baptized as an adult the day before at the Red River Settlement. On the baptismal record she was noted as the daughter of Chief Factor Allan McDonald (RIN #57432) and "a native woman". The presiding cleric was David Thomas Jones.<sup>23</sup> No date of birth was given for Sophia on either her baptismal or marriage record. Sophia Livingstone was buried on August 8, 1835 at the age of 24 years old. Her death was recorded in HBC extracts from the registers of baptism, marriages and burials in Ruperts Land. Her age of 24 at the time of her death in 1835 gives Sophia's year of birth as 1811.<sup>24</sup> The biographical sheet for Allan McDonell provides Sophia's dates as 1811 to 1835, so is consistent with the primary records.
- **Angus Cameron McDonnell** (RIN #22695) was born at Lake Temiskaming.<sup>25</sup> He was baptized on August 8, 1838 at the Red River. His age at baptism was not given. His parents were named as Chief Factor Allen McDonald (RIN #57432) and "a native woman;" he was living in the Lac La Pluie District at the time of his baptism. The presiding cleric was David Thomas Jones, the minister who baptized and married Angus' sister Sophia, buried his sister Margaret, and baptised his mother Margaret Cameron between 1833 and 1835.<sup>26</sup> Angus' father Allan McDonell was the Chief Factor in charge

of the Lac La Pluie District from June 1837 to around March 1840, serving at Fort Frances and Fort Alexander.<sup>27</sup> It is most likely that Angus was with his father at the time of his baptism at the Red River.

- The 1871 Census for Montreal lists Angus McDonell along with his wife Anna and their children Agnes, Allen, Arthur, Edwin and Cameron. Angus' age is given as 42 giving him a birthyear of 1829, this would have been while Allan McDonell was working as Chief trader for the Temiscamingue District.<sup>28</sup>

No HBC biographical sheet has been located for an Angus McDonell or McDonald. However, additional information has been located for Angus Cameron MacDonell. It is helpful for understanding the content of his mother's will which is discussed in Section 3.2.b, below.

- Angus Cameron Mark Macdonell, married Anna Maria Mansfield Mullins in 1854 in Montreal.<sup>29</sup> On the marriage record Angus is noted as the son of age of Allan Lundy Macdonell and Dame Ann Cameron. Angus' sister Anne Macdonell was a witness to the marriage.
- Angus remarried in 1880 to Marie Louise Filletreault in Montreal.<sup>30</sup> He was noted as the widower of his first wife, Anna Maria Mansfield Mullins, who is noted as having died in 1876 on Angus C. MacDonell's obituary mentioned below.
- Angus Cameron Macdonell died in January 1903 in Montreal.<sup>31</sup> The obituary published in the *Montreal Star* noted he was the son of Allan Lundy Macdonell formerly of the HBC. His mother was not named and no age at death was recorded.<sup>32</sup> The article named his first and second wives and his surviving children who resided in the city, namely Mrs. E de Bellefeuille (Agnes Ann McDonell) and Miss Geraldine Macdonell.
- Angus Cameron McDonell's son, Allan G. MacDonell, was born on August 22, 1856. He applied for an American passport in 1919. On his application he declared that he was the son of Angus MacDonell who was born in Fort Temiskaming, Ontario and deceased at the time of the application. Allan had immigrated to the United States from Montreal in 1874.<sup>33</sup>

- **Ann McDonell** (RIN #23582) is identified as one of Allan MacDonell and Margaret Cameron's children.<sup>34</sup> She was likely the daughter who was reported to be living with her mother around the time of Allan McDonell's death in 1859.<sup>35</sup> Angus Cameron McDonell's sister "Anne" witnessed his marriage in 1854 in Montreal.<sup>36</sup> She married Alex McK. Cowie of Montreal on July 30, 1863. On the marriage announcement she was said to be the "only daughter of the late Allan Lundy Macdonell."<sup>37</sup> The other two documented daughters of Allan Macdonell, Sophia and Margaret, had died at the Red River Settlement in the 1830s. Subject ancestor Cecile McDonell was alive at the time; she died in 1875.<sup>38</sup>
- **John McDonnell** (RIN #22696) was imprisoned and sent to Australia.<sup>39</sup> He died there in 1907 at the age of 76 giving him a birthyear of 1831.<sup>40</sup>
- **Allan McDonnell (Jr.)** (RIN #5867) is listed in several sources but no further information has been located regarding his life or whereabouts.<sup>41</sup>
- **Alexander McDonnell** (RIN #14097) joined the HBC at the age of 17 under the guidance of his father Allan McDonell.<sup>42</sup> He was born in 1809. When he married Mary Ann McKay (RIN #14098) at the Temiskaming HBC post in 1837 he was described as "Metis." While his parents were not named on the marriage document, his father was known to be Allan McDonell, who was born in Scotland, and whose country wife was Margaret Cameron, the daughter of fur trader Aeneas Cameron and an Indigenous woman from Lake Temiskaming, as discussed. Taken together the evidence indicates that Alexander inherited his Indigenous identity from his mother Margaret Cameron. Alexander was the father of ancestor Anna McDonald.

### *3.2.b Margaret Anne Cameron's Will and Age at Death*

The respondent submitted the last will and testament of Anne Cameron and several documents related to the individuals named in her will. The will is outlined below along with her burial record and other family documents.

Margaret Cameron (RIN #14101), the wife of Sir Allan Lundy MacDonell was buried in August 1885. On the burial document she was named "Anne Cameron McDonell" and identified as the widow of Allan Lundy Macdonell formerly of a chief factor of the Hudson's Bay Company.<sup>43</sup> Allan McDonell's HBC biography sheet and Elaine Mitchell's study of the fur trade at Fort Temiskaming noted that Allan retired to Montreal with his country wife, known as Margaret, a native woman said to be the daughter of Aeneas Cameron. Allan had succeeded Aeneas Cameron as chief factor at Temiskaming and continued to be in contact with him after retiring to Montreal.<sup>44</sup> Evidence of the children Margaret Cameron shared with Allan McDonell confirms that Anne Cameron McDonell and Margaret Cameron are the same person, the country wife of Allan McDonell.

The Enrolment Officer's Report for Anna McDonald (RIN #2197) read her age as 86 years (quatre vingt six). The respondent read her age as 96 (quatre vingt seiz(e) with the final 'e' missing). A comparison with other records on the page supports the respondent's conclusion that the age was 96 and not 86. This would suggest a year of birth around 1789. Note that the 1871 census lists Ann Cameron living with her daughter Ann in Montreal. The age given for Ann Cameron on that census is 64, which would give her a birth year of 1807. As per the list of documented children for whom birth years are known (listed in subsection 3.2.a.), Margaret Ann Cameron's children were born from 1811 to 1831, suggesting that the age on the census record is incorrect.

The respondent submitted the last will and testament of "Dame Ann Cameron widow of late Allan Macdonell," dated September 23, 1879.<sup>45</sup> The document identifies her as the widow of the late Allan Macdonell, formerly a chief factor of the Hudson's Bay Company. The will indicates that she was unable to write and she signed with an X. She named her son Angus and his children in her will. The son and grandchildren who are named in the will have also been identified in corroborating documents, as follows:<sup>46</sup>

- her son: Angus Cameron Macdonell of Montreal, baptism and death records noted above.
  - her granddaughter: Dame Agnes Ann MacDonell, wife of Edouard Lefebvre de Bellefeuille of Montreal. Agnes Anne McDonell was the daughter of Angus Cameron Mark McDonell and Anna Maria Mansfield Mullins, baptized in 1855 in Montreal.<sup>47</sup> Allan Lundy McDonell was the godfather to the girl.

- her grandson: Edwin Macdonell (son of Angus Cameron and his first wife Anne Maria Mullins), baptized in 1862 in Montreal.<sup>48</sup>
- her grandson: Louis Cameron Macdonell (son of Angus Cameron and his first wife Anne Maria Mansfield Mullins), baptized in 1868 in Montreal.<sup>49</sup> Gerald Allen Alexander McDonell and Agnes Anne McDonell were named as godparents. The godparents would be the siblings of Louis Cameron. Agnes Ann would be 13 at the time of baptism, and Gerald Allen would be 12.
- her grandson: [illegible first name] Joseph Macdonell.
- her granddaughter: Geraldine Macdonell (daughter of Angus Cameron and his first wife Anna Maria Mullins), baptized in 1876 in Montreal.<sup>50</sup>

Alexander predeceased his mother so was not named in her will and none of Alexander's children were named in her will. However, two of Alexander's children had been left a legacy by Alexander's father Allan Macdonell who died several decades before his wife in 1859. Alexander predeceased his father which is the likely reason that Allan left money to these grandchildren.<sup>51</sup>

Other documented children of Margaret Anne Cameron and Allan McDonell were not named in her will. Sophia, Alexander, and Margaret are known to have died before Margaret Anne Cameron. Her son John had been transported to Australia as a convict; he did not die until 1907 but was not included in her will. The son Allan, for whom we have no information, was not named in the will. Her daughter Ann was also not named in her will. As noted above, she married in 1863; her date of death is not known.

Their daughter Ann's marriage in 1863 is of significance. Allan Lundy Cameron died in 1859; his death announcement was recorded in the *Montreal Gazette*.<sup>52</sup> Ann McDonell was married after her father's death in 1863, to Alexander McKenzie Cowie at the Anglican Christ Church in Montreal.<sup>53</sup> The church marriage record does not name the parents of either the bride or groom; however, an article in the *Montreal Gazette* announcing the marriage of Annie McDonell and Alex. McK. Cowie names Ann's father as the late Allan Lundy MacDonell of Montreal. Her mother is not named. Of particular note is the reference to Ann being named Allan's "only" daughter.<sup>54</sup> This is particularly relevant given that Cecile Mawishk McDonell did not die until 1875. The other two documented daughters of Allan McDonell, Sophia and Margaret, had died at the Red River in the 1830s.

### **3.3 Connections between Alexander McDonell and Cecile McDonell**

The respondent asserts that Alexander McDonell and Cecile McDonell were siblings and that Alexander's daughter Anna McDonell/McDonald (RIN #2197) was the niece of Cecile. The following documents were presented to demonstrate the close relationship between the family of the subject ancestor Cecile McDonell (RIN #14687) and her reputed brother Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097).

The respondent notes that Anna McDonell/McDonald (RIN #2197), the daughter of Alexander McDonell and Mary Ann McKay, was baptized on June 15, 1845 at Temiscamingue. He reports her godfather was Narcisse Dorion. Note that Narcisse was married to Cecile McDonell.

- Anna McDonell (RIN #2197) was baptized on June 15, 1845 at Temiscaming.<sup>55</sup> Her parents were noted as Alexander McDonnell and Manian McKay. The godparents were named as "Narcisse ron et Manian Kakikepkwe".

The respondent notes that Daniel Dorion was baptized May 30, 1847 at Mattawa.

- Daniel Dorion (RIN #57491) was born on March 16, 1847 and baptized on May 30, 1847 at Mattawa. His parents were named as Narcisse Dorion and Cecile McDonell. His godmother was Marianne McKay.<sup>56</sup> Mary Anne McKay (RIN # 14098) was married to Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097).

The respondent notes that Alexander Dorion was baptized on September 27, 1849 at Mattawa. His godfather was Alexander McDonell.

- Alexander Dorion (RIN #15680) was baptized on September 27, 1849 at the age of 2 months. His parents were noted as Narcisse Dorion and "Cecile McDonall". His godfather was Alexander McDonnell.<sup>57</sup>

The respondent notes that Alfred McDonnell was baptized June 20, 1864 at Mattawa. His godmother was Marguerite Dorion, daughter of Narcisse Dorion and Cecile McDonell.

- Alfred McDonnell (RIN #1787) was born on February 2, 1864 and baptized on June 20, 1864. His parents were noted as Johny McDonnell (RIN #3773) and "Angenique \_abikwe" (aka Manian Inini dit Napons, RIN #3774).<sup>58</sup> Alfred's godmother was Marguerite Dorion.

The respondent notes that Allen McDonell was baptized on July 27, 1873 at Mattawa. His godparents were Narcisse Dorion and Cecile McDonell

- Allen McDonnell (RIN #57490) was baptized on July 26, 1873. His parents were noted as Johnny McDonnell (RIN #3773) and Angelique Dufond (aka Manian Inini dit Napons, RIN #3774). The godparents were listed as Narcisse Dorion and Cecile McDonnell, his wife.<sup>59</sup>

In addition, the Enrolment Officer's Report notes that:

- Sophie McDonnell (RIN #14099) married Joseph Berube on October 25, 1878 at Mattawa. The marriage document noted that she was the daughter of the deceased Alexandre McDonald and deceased Marie Anne McCail (aka McKay). Narcisse Dorion (RIN #14686) witnessed the wedding.<sup>60</sup> Note that ancestor Cecile Mawiskak McDonnell (RIN #14687) had died by this time; Narcisse Dorion was her widower.

The Enrolment Officer agrees that the above cited documents demonstrate a close relationship between the family of the subject ancestor Cecile McDonnell dit Mawishk (RIN #14687) and Alexander McDonnell (RIN #14097) and his family over the period from at least 1845 to 1873 in the Mattawa area. Note however that no primary historical document specifies that they are siblings.

### **3.4 Algonquin heritage**

The respondent concludes that Alexander McDonnell (RIN #14097) and Cecile McDonnell were full brother and sister and that they were Algonquin. The evidence regarding their Algonquin identity is reviewed below.

The Respondent submits that Alexander McDonnell's daughter Sophie McDonnell (RIN #14099) is identified in historical records as being Algonquin. As documented in the Enrolment Officer's Report, a review of the census records from 1861 to 1911 includes the following years that provide an ethnic origin for Sophie McDonnell/McDonald, who married Joseph Ferris, as:

- 1881 census: Scotch;<sup>61</sup>
- 1901 census: Scotch Breed and Red. The Indigenous families on this sheet are listed as Algonquin, FB (French Breed), or SB (Scotch Breed);<sup>62</sup> and
- 1911 census: French.<sup>63</sup>

The Respondent submits that Alexander McDonnell's daughter Anne/Anna McDonnell (RIN #2197) is identified in historical documents as being Algonquin. As documented in the Enrolment Officer's Report, a review of the census records from 1871 to 1921 includes the following years that provide an ethnic origin for Anna McDonnell/McDonald (RIN #2197), who married Walter Ferris, as:

- 1871 census: Scotch;<sup>64</sup>
- 1881 census: Indian;<sup>65</sup>
- 1901 census: Algonquin Scotch Breed and Red;<sup>66</sup>
- 1911 census: Scotch;<sup>67</sup> and
- 1921 census: ~~Algonquin~~ Indian.<sup>68</sup> The entire family was identified as "Indian" written to replace "Algonquin," which was struck through.

The Respondent submits that Cecile McDonell's daughter Caroline is listed as Indian on the 1881 census. As documented in the Enrolment Officer's Report, a review of the census records from 1871 to 1901 includes the following years that provide an ethnic origin for Caroline Dorion (RIN #13764), who married Joseph Lapensee, as:

- 1871 census: French;<sup>69</sup>
- 1881 census: Indian;<sup>70</sup> and
- 1901 census: French.<sup>71</sup>

The Respondent submits that Cecile McDonell's daughter Marie Cecile was listed as Indian on 1881 census and Red on 1901 census. As documented in the Enrolment Officer's Report, a review of the census records from 1871 to 1901 includes the following years that provide an ethnic origin for Marie Cecile Dorion (RIN #3787), who married John McCrackan, as:

- 1871 census: French;<sup>72</sup>
- 1881 census: Indian;<sup>73</sup> and
- 1901 census: French Breed and Red.<sup>74</sup>

The Respondent submits that Cecile McDonell's daughter Sophie was listed as Indian on the 1881 census and Red on 1901 census. As documented in the Enrolment Officer's Report, a review of the census records from 1871 to 1911 includes the following years that provide an ethnic origin for Sophie Dorion (RIN #3770), who married Antoine Colton, as:

- 1871 census: French;<sup>75</sup>
- 1881 census: Indian;<sup>76</sup>
- 1901 census: "mR" and French (i.e., mixed French and Indigenous);<sup>77</sup> and

- 1911 census: French.<sup>78</sup>

#### *3.4.a Service records of Alexander McDonell*

The respondent asserts that Alexander McDonell (RIN #14097) is mentioned many times as a "Native" working with HBC.

Alexander McDonell's HBC biographical sheet shows his parish of origin as "Indian Country." This suggests he was born somewhere in the territory in which his father served as a trader for the HBC.<sup>79</sup> His contract confirms 1809 as his year of birth. The ethnic identity of Alexander's mother Margaret Ann Cameron, the daughter of Aeneas Cameron and his country wife from the Temiskaming area is discussed in section 3.2, above.

The respondent attached HBC account records for Alexander MacDonell/McDonell, showing him first as an apprentice in the Swan River District with a contract expiring in 1831. Later record shows him at Lac La Pluie and then at Temiskaming in the Moose District. These records of accounts are consistent with his contract and HBC Biographical Sheet. The use of the term "Native" in this context indicates that he was born in the HBC country as opposed to being born in Lower Canada or Europe. As noted above, he was born in 1809, at which time it is highly unlikely that any non-Indigenous woman was present and giving birth in that territory. The earliest records show his parish of origin as "Native." From 1835 his records note him as being from Hudson Bay, then from "Indian Country" beginning in 1845. The records supplied by the respondent are summarized below:

- The 1840-1841 account did not provide an age for Alexander. His Parish of origin was noted as Hudson Bay.<sup>93</sup> He is now noted as a Steersman at Temiscamingue being in the Moose District with his contract expiring in 1841.

service and employment of the said company in North America in the capacity of Apprentice Labourer  
and that he will embark when thereunto required, on board such ship or vessel as shall be appointed  
by the said company, and proceed to Hudsons Bay and for the term of five years to be  
reckoned from the date of his embarkation, and for such further time as hereinafter mentioned and faithfully  
devote the whole of his time and labour in their service and for their sole benefit, and that he  
will do his duty as such and perform all such work and service by day or by night, for the said  
company as he shall be required to do, and obey all orders, which he shall receive from the Governor,  
or the company in North America, or their Officers or Agents for the time being. And that he  
will with courage and fidelity in his said service, defend the property of the said company  
and their factories and territories. And will not absent himself from the said service, nor engage  
or be concerned in any trade or employment, whatsoever, for the benefit of the said company  
and according to their rules. And that all Breeches obtained by Barter with the Indians or otherwise  
which shall come to the hands or possession of the said Alexander McDonnell shall be held by

James Monwick has requested me to remind you of a debt which he felt diffident to trouble you about during the winter, and would not now, but that his own means are rapidly diminishing.

It is for board, firing & lodging of your family; say the mother for two years, one daughter for 1½ year, the other for ½ year; or in all equal to two persons for two years. The Governor made no bargain with him when he placed them there, but in my hearing promised him a fair remuneration. His claim is £6 p annum for each person, amounting to £24 in all, which is about a third less than the usual charge in the settlement for such accommodation.

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# Understanding the Index to HBC Servants' Contracts, 1776 -1927

The Hudson's Bay Company Archives holds thousands of servants' contracts, which date from about 1776-1927. This index includes the majority of these contracts, but this only represents a portion of the employees hired to work for the Hudson's Bay Company. If a person's name is not in this index, the contract may not have survived, it may be missing or filed elsewhere, or it may not have been created in the first place (this was often the case when individuals were employed for casual or seasonal work).

### Name

This is often an approximate age which appears at the top of the contract.

### Origin

This is the employee's place (generally a parish) of origin or where his first contract was signed. An example of a typical entry is "Scot OKI Birsay" where:

- Scot = Scotland
- OKI = Orkney Isles
- Birsay = Parish of Birsay / Name of the hamlet or farm

### Work Location

## DR. ANGUS C. MACDONELL, WELL KNOWN PHYSICIAN, HAS PASSED AWAY.

The death is announced of Dr. Angus C. Macdonell, one of the oldest physicians in Montreal.

The event took place at the family residence, 778 Lagauchitiere street, yesterday, as a result of pneumonia, contracted during the recent cold spell while the doctor was visiting a patient.

The deceased was the eldest son of the late Allan Lundy Macdonell, formerly of Inverness, Scotland, and latterly of this city, chief factor of the Hudson Bay Company, and governor at Fort Temiscamingue.

Dr. Macdonell, after studying at the high school in this city and the Upper Canada College, Toronto, entered McGill University, where he secured his degree of M. D. in 1852.

On his return from Europe in 1854, he married Miss Anna Mansfield Mullins, sister of the late poet and authoress, Mrs. Leprohon. Mrs. Macdonell, died in 1876, and in 1880 he married Miss Marie L. Filia-trault, who survives him.

He leaves six children, of whom Mrs. E. L. de Bellefeuille and Miss Geraldine Macdonell are residents of this city.

The doctor was for more than twenty years on the consulting staff of the Hotel Dieu Hospital, and for many years attending physician on the Roman Catholic arch-bishops.
