“In 1857, five family heads (Joseph Tenesco, Michel Pesindawatch, Paul Pesindawatch, Ignace Shawinasaketch and Benoit Konini), representing 30 people, petitioned for land where they had focused their activities at Golden Lake for several generations,” she said. “They asked for 200 acres for each of the five families.” Canada purchased the land for the reserve from Ontario at 10 cents per acre (\$156.10 for 1,561 acres). It was patented to Indian Affairs in 1873. An anniversary event will be held this year said Chief Jocko.”

In Charles Thomas journals we see frequent mention of the Pesindawatch family, Ignace Shawinasaketch and other Algonquin people and women who brought he and Hannah rabbits, a canoe and often spent social time with them so there was a friendship and camaradie and obviously they were both respected. In fact one of the Pesindawatch men got so drunk he had to spend the night at the stopping place of Charles and Hannah. This completely contrary to the angry attackds by Makwa back in 1833 whose radism for white people had Thomas labelled as “white” which we know he was not. He was Cree from Moose Factory and met Hannah Mannall later to be his wife when he was stationed at the Frederick House area.

From Charles Thomas Diary and heads of families who visited him and Hannah showing a close respectful and mutually supportive relationship.

**Diary entries of Charles Thomas show his and Hannahs continued socializing and trading with the Algonquin people around the Lake. They frequently stayed over at their stopping place. From his diaries covering period for 1850-1852. Much of his journals went missing but his reference to the Algonquin and other indigenous people of the area is frequent as they traded, hunted, fished and socialized together. Hannah, it seems had a special relationship with the other women of the area from the South Shore as they often fished together, socialized and made moccasins and mitts. We**

**know that the Pissendawas, Amable, Stokwa and Tenaskou were all Algonquin and their spelling may have changed over time as is often the case.**

February 21 – Paul Pissendawa still very unwell

February 24 – Went down to see folks bottom of Lake – Stokwa was there and Paul still ill

March 3 – Pissendawa went by on way to hunting expedition and Perrigo arrived with some flour for us

J. Bte Pissendawa and young Ignaias off for hunting but Old Pissendawa was very drunk

April 9 – Louis Laverille died at Perrigos shanty

19<sup>th</sup> – Pissendawa and wife up in their canoe to tell us they found the remains of our dog killed by wolves on Lac D'ore River

October 29 – Ignias and Son and Perrigo came by

November 1 – I bought Mrs. Pissendawas 3 foot canoe and paid her 6 dollars

November 4 – Had venison with our son Charles Jr., Old Mother Makwa, Joe and Simon passed by and Pelerin here for the night.

November 17 – Joe Tenaskou arrived at night and stayed over

November 18 – Hannah and girls busy making mitts and moccasins as weather is impossible to attend to nets. Maldoon and Beaudoin stayed night

November 23 – Old Mother, Pissendawa and Tyandgike up on a visit and reported that Marian Pissendawa is ill

January 25 – Ignias and wife up

February 5 – Took Pissendawa and J. Pissendawa to Round Lake with their things for a long hunting expedition

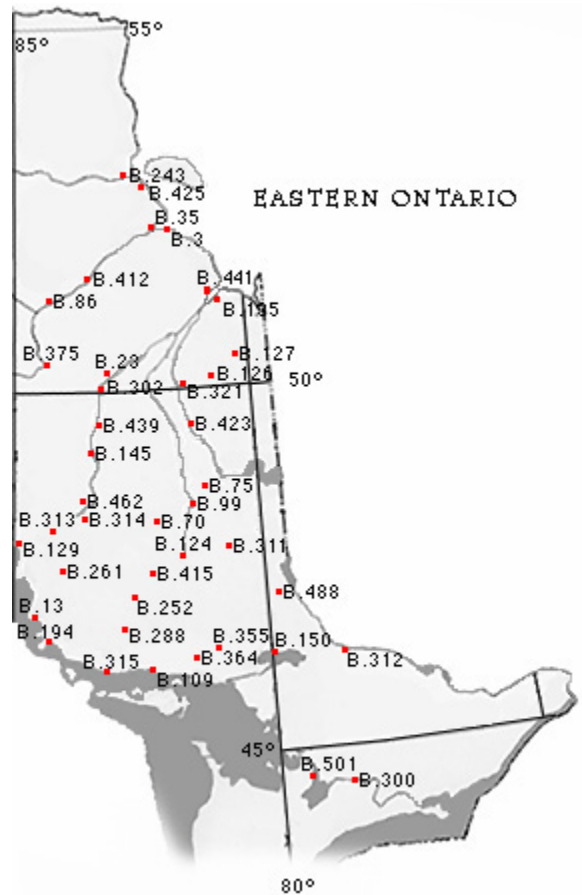
February 11 – Perrigo and Payet stayed as bad weather

**There was never an HBC post at Golden Lake and Charles never worked at one if there if there was. That rumour perpetuated by even some family members is erroneous. The above map is from the HBC Archives. Charles Thomas and Hannah Mannall went there to open a stopping place which was called “Charlie’s Hope”. It became just that, a place for people to stay coming and going from Bytown (Ottawa) to the Basin Depot (Algonquin Park) for the logging trade. It was also a place people stayed at on route to other locations such as Round Lake during long travel or winter storms or overnight if they were having a social. You also see in his bio from the HBC that the last place he worked for the HBC was at Lake of Two Mountains in 1831 and retired in 1832-33 when he ended up in Golden Lake**

## **Obituary in the Renfrew Mercury Friday Mar 14, 1873:**

"At Golden Lake, on Saturday, the 8th quite unexpectedly, at the advanced age of 80 years, Mr. Charles Thomas. He had resided at Golden Lake for a number of years, and was one of the oldest pioneers on the Bonnechere River. His father was formerly Governor of one of the Hudson Bay Company's Posts; and Mr. Thomas being possessed of a good education, held different trusts under him.

In all his dealings with the public, he earned the respect and esteem of all. He was upright and independent, honest and honorable generous and a fast friend. For his years he was a hale hearty man, and in the best of spirits; and his sudden decease has cast a gloom upon the village of Eganville, where he was better known. He was a gentleman of most kind and pleasing manners much respected in his walk of life.

For the past thirty years he kept an accurate Diary, and was preparing it for publication. It contains thrilling excitements and perilous adventures in the Northwest, and pleasing reminiscences that took place on the different chains of lakes on the Bonnechere, Madawaska &c
