NATIONALITY is defined as the country in which the person owes allegiance. The term "Canadian" should be used of persons born in Canada. Every person born in Canada should be entered as "Canadian" unless he or she has subsequently become the citizen of another country.  
RACIAL ORIGIN will be described by stating to what people or race each of the parents belongs, whether English, Irish, Scottish, French, German, Russian, Ukrainian, Lithuanian, etc. The words "Canadian" or "American" should not be used for Racial Origin. They express nationality or citizenship, not race.
