The Enrolment Officer's Task

To assist Tribunal in determining whether it would be reasonable to conclude that Cecile McDonnell dite Mawishk is properly considered an "Algonquin Ancestor"

Conduct research on the ancestor

Present findings of research

Provide historical and genealogical context to research findings

Algonquin Ancestor

"Algonquin Ancestor" means

> a person who was born on or before July 15, 1897

identified in an historic record or document dated on or before December 31, 1921

in such a way that it would be reasonable to conclude that the person was considered to be an <u>Algonquin or Nipissing</u>, or a sibling of such a person

In this definition, a sibling of a person is a person with a common Algonquin parent

Added to Preliminary List of Algonquin Ancestors

> Added by a Board decision in April 2000

A protest against Cecile McDonnell was dismissed in 2011

Sources of Information

- Various baptism, marriage & death/burial records for Cecile McDonnell, her spouse Narcisse Dorion, and their children
- 1861-1921 census for Cecile McDonnell, her spouse Narcisse Dorion, and their children
- Biographical records and entries for Allan McDonell, John McDonell; last will and testament of Margaret Ann Cameron
- 1865 Petition from Mattawa
- Maps and secondary source regarding John and Magdeleine Poitras, HBC trading posts, Moose Factory and the Moose District, Native Peoples c.1823

Name Variations

- Cecile McDonnel's family name was variously written as McDonell, McDonald with Mawiskak or dite Mawishk attached
- Cecile was sometimes referred to as Marie Cecile, Cecile Magdelaine or simply Marie
- Cecile's married name was Dorion, also rendered as Dorian, Lorrion, Laurion, Lorion

Place Names

Sauteur or Saulteaux

• Sauteur or Saulteaux name given by French-speakers to an Ojibwe/Ojibway group in southern Manitoba and Saskatchewan; also known as Western Ojibwa

Rupert's Land, NWT, Upper Canada, Ontario

- Rupert's Land was HBC charter lands to 1870, purchased by Canada became NWT
- Manitoba created around Red River settlement 1870, boundary north of Lake Manitoba, mid Lake Winnipeg by 1882, current location by 1912
- Upper Canada to height of land above Lake Superior to 1783
- Ontario boundary northward in 1874, expands north to Albany River by 1889

Cecile McDonnell, her Spouse and Children

- Cecile born about 1812-13 (based on age at death)
- □ Jan 16, 1834 Cecile had a daughter with Narcisse Lorrion; baptized at Pointe-aux-Tremble on February 7, 1835 at 14 months old
- 1836 Cecile and Narcisse baptized a son Narcis, three months, at Mattawa, she is identified as Cicile Mawishk, a "Sauteurs"
- 1837 Marie Cecile Mcdonell dite Mawish married Narcis Laurion at Temiskaming; he worked for the HBC at Mattawa; she was identified as "Metisse"; children Marie and Narcis legitimized
- 1839 baptized daughter Sophie, born December 1838; godmother Marie Ann Tepinaganokwe, at Mattawa
- 1845 baptized daughter Caroline Marianne at Mattawa; Cecile is identified as Cecile McDonell; godparents Simon Nimasiba and Marie 8ackijikok8e
- 1847 baptized son Daniel, at Mattawa; godparents Louis Bastien (spouse of Marie Josette Sipikwe) and Marianne McKay (mother of Anna McDonald)

Cecile McDonnell, her Spouse & Children, cont.

- 1849 baptized son Alexander, recorded in Temiscamingue Indian Register; godfather Alexander McDonell (father of Anna McDonald)
- □ 1860 daughter Sophie married Antoine Colton (aka Bastien, son of Marie Josette Sipikwe)
- 1861 census at Mattawa listed Cecile with husband Narcisse, five children and three grandchildren; Cecile noted as born in Upper Canada
- 1864 daughter Caroline Dorion married Joseph Lapensee at Mattawa; Marguerite, daughter of Cecile and Narcisse godmother to Alfred McDonnell son of Johny McDonnell and Angenique (aka Manian Inini dite Napons)
- 1871 census at Mattawa listed Cecile with husband Narcisse, four children; Cecile noted as born in Manitoba and Scotch; sharing dwelling with George Hunter and Philomene Mikkima dite MicMac, a descendant of Pierre Nicholas Mikkima; three other adult men in dwelling
- 1873 Cecile and Narcisse are godparents to Allen McDonnel, son of Johny Mcdonell and Angelique Dufond (aka Manian Inini dite Napons)
- □ 1875 Cecile died and buried at Mattawa, about 62 years old

Narcisse Dorion

- Where did Narcisse Dorion meet Cecile McDonnell dite Mawishk?
- First known child Marie Cecile born January 16, 1834; likely conceived around April 1833
- Narcisse signed a three-year contract at Norway House Manitoba in June 1830; served as a middleman (paddler)
- Norway House is around boundary area between Swampy Cree and Ojibwa at this time
- Returned to Montreal area in July 1834; Marie Cecile baptized February 1835
- Assigned to Mattawa, 1835-37 and Lac des Allumettes (1837-1840) as a labourer
- 1865 Narcisse and his son Alexandre signed petition from "Indians of Mattawa" requesting a mission for the Indigenous community
- 1881 census at Mattawa as widower living with Johny McDonell; no relationship between Narcisse and Johny noted on census; Johny McDonell is brother of Anna McDonald, who also signed 1865 petition
- 1887 Narcisse died at Mattawa noted as widower of Cecile McDonnell; their son Alexander was witness

Children of Cecile & Narcisse

Records for Cecile's children may give information on her place of birth, ethnic identity; searched marriage, death/burial and census records of the children

- Marie Cecile, Sophie and Caroline identified as Indian on 1881 census at Mattawa
- Sophie lists as "mR" and French on 1901 census, Papineau Township
- Marie Cecile listed as "R" and French Breed in 1901, at Mattawa
- Cecile's place of birth listed in 1891 census as North West Territories (Marie Cecile's return) and Manitoba (Sophie and Caroline's returns)

Cecile McDonnell's Parents

No records name the parents of Cecile McDonnell; several possibilities have been suggested:

- **Allan McDonnell** and **Margaret Ann Cameron** sources such as: Allan's HBC record, Margaret Ann's will, Elaine Mitchell's study, show Allan and Margaret Ann had the following children:
- Alexander McDonnell (1809-1853) HBC servant; two children left a legacy by Allan; predeceased Margaret. Alexander is the father of Anna McDonald and Johny McDonald
- Sophia (1811-1835) predeceased Margaret
- Margaret (1819-1833) predeceased her mother Margaret
- Angus Cameron Macdonell (c. 1829-1903) is executor of his mother's will, his children inherited
- John McDonnell (1831-1907) imprisoned and transported to Australia where he died
- Ann Mcdonell (1837- aft 1863) living with Margaret in Montreal, witnessed marriage of her brother Angus in 1854, married in 1863 said to be the "only daughter of the late Allan Lundy Macdonell"; sisters Sophia and Margaret had died in 1830s
- Allan McDonnell (Jr): listed in sources but no information on his dates, life or whereabouts

Cecile McDonnell's Parents

Other suggestions for parents of Cecile McDonnell:

- John MacDonell/McDonell (1762-1850) and Magdeleine Poitra (c. 1782)
 - 1813 marriage legitimized six children born 1799 to 1812; including "Cicillia" born 1810 at Ile à la Crosse, Sask; she died in 1818
- No other potential parents with appropriate names and dates have been located

Summary / Issues

- Parents unknown
- Place of birth various: Upper Canada/Ontario (1861), Manitoba (1871, 1891), NWT (1891)
- Ethnic identity various: Sauteurs (1836), Metisse (1837), Scotch (1871); daughters listed as Indian (1881), "R" and French Breed (1901), "mR" and French (1901)
- Closely involved with Algonquin individuals and households: daughter Sophie married Algonquin man (1860); witnessed Algonquin family events (e.g. 1847, 1849, 1873 baptisms); resided with other Algonquins (1871 Mattawa); spouse and son signed 1865 petition from Indians of Mattawa
