19th Sunday. Wind N.W. Weather in evening, a high night temperature and Breeze light as before. Tomorrow getting for the ship, before parting the roof of the new still. However, Sundry just making small vessels, these boats on the bay. Boat carrying stores down to the ship. The others were employed pulling stores on board the boat and pulling together for the ship. Shipwright received the ship's food who has received some considerable savings in consequence of his getting around in morning. - George, Minkies went off for E.M. with letters. one of the boxes returned out of yesterday returned, one containing another box, which I saw they were off with which found very lucky; it was then when instead of four boxes, who being very awkward and not able to do his part as Mr. Sutherland thinks. - Capt. Men Sutherland were engaged to the laborers were pulling water tanks and stores on board the long boat, pulling the boats, some have been long on board the ship and then went down to the ship, the Sutherland is engaged on the last evening, the ship arrived in daylight, four R. Sutherland, Hamilton and Mr. Paul were up, the boat that returned here yesterday out of again with the boat.
